## CEFC TAIPEI HISTORY

The Taipei antenna of the French Centre for Research on Contemporary China (CEFC) was created in 1994, as a branch of the CEFC in Hong Kong (established in 1991). The Centre is located since 1998 at the Research Center for Humanities and Social Sciences (RCHSS) in Academia Sinica, one of the most prestigious research institute in Taiwan.

The CEFC is a publicly funded research institute, supported by the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the French National Centre for Scientific Research (CNRS). The CEFC Taipei is the only French research centre dedicated to Taiwan.

The Centre actively promotes doctoral research by funding mobility grants and hosting the awardees in the Centre. The CEFC organises research seminars and cooperates with the French Office in Taipei.

The CEFC publishes the interdisciplinary academic journal *China Perspectives*, which focuses on the political, social, economic and cultural evolutions of the Sinophone world (PRC, Hong Kong, Macao, and Taiwan). *China Perspectives* is indexed in the Social Sciences Citation Index (SSCI) and The European Reference Index for the Humanities and the Social Sciences (ERIH PLUS).
